

MEDICINAL PLANTS OF LAKSHADWEEP



Islands constitute unique ecosystems often comprising of many habitat-specific and endemic organisms that are found nowhere else on the Earth. These habitats contribute in different forms for the livelihood, economy, well-being and cultural identity of millions of people around the globe. At the same time, islands are ecologically fragile and extremely vulnerable to global warming, sea level rise and other natural disasters.

The Lakshadweep archipelago, along with Maldives and Chagos in the Indian Ocean together form a vast submarine mountain range, the Chagos-Laccadive Plateau. This plateau comprises the most extensive coral reef and atoll community in the Indian Ocean as well as the largest atoll system in the world. Lakshadweep is rich in marine biodiversity and also island biodiversity which are distributed in diverse habitats. Apart from coral reefs and seaweeds these islands have many habitat-specific species and medicinal plants. The Islanders use a wide variety of plants for their daily needs and also as an immediate remedy for various ailments.

Medicinal Plants Diversity in Lakshadweep Islands




As per the latest study, conducted in the year 2018 by a team of scientists from Kerala Forest Research Institute, in Lakshadweep islands, there are 211 species of medicinal plants, which is about 45 percent of total vascular plants recorded from the area. These medicinal plants include seventy-seven species used in various traditional medicines, sixteen species, which also have nutraceutical importance and more than 35 species which have high market potential. The traditional healers of Island also possess rich knowledge about raw drug distribution in the islands and also healing values of medicinal plants. Among the islands in Lakshadweep, Minicoy island is comparatively rich in terms of medicinal plant diversity.

A well-designed, visitors-friendly medicinal plants garden is established at Kavaratti, which hosts more than 200 medicinal plants which belong to different habitats in the island and use categories. The herbal garden includes plants unique to Lakshadweep also from the mainland. This garden serves as an awareness centre and live germplasm of medicinal plants.

Ailments: Wound, Ulcer, Diarrhoea




Caesalpinia bonduc (L.) Roxb.

Ailments: Hair growth, Aborifacient


Clerodendrum inerme (L.) Gaertn.
